Dear Secretary Azar,

The undersigned 110 health organizations are deeply concerned that funding to care for immigrant children—those forcibly separated from their parents at the border, and those detained in custody for extended periods of time—as a direct result of the administration's immigration policies, is being drawn directly from money appropriated in fiscal year 2018 for public health and medical research. There is widespread support throughout the community to care for immigrant children and families, but redirecting funding from already underfunded programs is deeply concerning. We urge the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to make public its plan to respond to and recover from this public health crisis, and to request that Congress provide the funding necessary, through annual or supplemental appropriations legislation, to ensure the health and wellbeing of children and families in the Department's care.

Historically, the HHS Secretary has used his or her statutory authority to transfer funding to support new or unexpected priorities. What makes the current situation different, however, is it is the administration's own policies that have necessitated these significant transfers. Further, the administration has proposed other policy changes that would allow for the indefinite detention of immigrant families and would have significant financial and human costs.

The decision to use the Secretary's authority to cut public health and medical research programs is understandable given the immediacy of this crisis. We fear, however, that funding transfers to date are just the beginning. To the community's knowledge, the administration has not yet submitted a comprehensive funding request to Congress to avoid future transfers, which is particularly concerning given that lawmakers have finalized funding for fiscal year 2019.

The health community is deeply troubled by the significant financial and human costs associated with the administration's immigration policies. The undersigned organizations look forward to learning more about the Department's plans and we stand ready to support the Department in securing the resources necessary to care for immigrant children and families.
