 - Current member of AST
 - Current member of the APP COP
 - In practice as a Transplant APP for < 5 years.

- Statement of interest explaining what you hope to gain from attending WTC and your goals within the field of transplantation

- Non-member sponsored by a current member of both the AST and the Transplant Diagnostics COP (active membership at time of application submission).

Application Requirements

Goal of this grant is to highlight and share an interesting clinical case report with educational value, rather than a research project.

1. Application
2. A single page description of a single clinical case in WTC abstract format (background; methods; results; conclusion) highlighting its importance and education value. We encourage inclusion of graphs, figures, and images.
3. Redact all patient information
4. If you are not an AST member, a current member of AST must write a short statement of support.

Judging of Case Submission

1. At least three (3) members of the Transplant Diagnostic COP will review and score each submission based on the following criteria:
 - Quality of the case (1 to 5)
 - Impact of the case on current transplant practice and body of literature in transplant diagnostics (1 to 5)
 - Novelty (1 to 5)

The AST Transplant Pharmacy Community of Practice (AST TxPharm COP) is committed to addressing health disparities and advancing diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging (DEIB), within the community. In support of this, the AST TxPharm COP DEIB workgroup offers travel grants to underrepresented minority pharmacy students, pharmacy residents interested in transplant pharmacy, transplant pharmacy residents or fellows, and new practitioners in transplant pharmacy. These grants are designed to help recipients become more involved in AST and advance their careers in transplant pharmacy.

Grant Description

The AST TxPharm COP DEIB travel grant aims to support pharmacy students, pharmacy residents interested in transplant pharmacy, transplant pharmacy residents or fellows, or new practitioners in transplant pharmacy. The award funds are intended to cover registration and travel expenses for AST meetings, such as American Transplant Congress, Fellows Symposium, Cutting Edge of Transplantation, and World Transplant Congress. Additionally, the funds may be used to maintain AST membership or support other forms of active involvement within the society.

Eligibility and Application Guidelines

Eligibility Criteria

- Eligibility is open to all individuals within the field of transplantation who currently hold a pharmacist role, have a pharmacy degree, or are in training for such a role. Preference will be given to the following groups:
 - I. First through fourth year Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) students.
 - II. PGY-1 or PGY-2 Solid Organ Transplant Pharmacy residents or fellows.
 - III. New practitioners within 2 years of PharmD graduation or post-graduate training.

- Applicants who identify as belonging to one or more historically underrepresented or marginalized groups in pharmacy are strongly encouraged to apply. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - I. Individuals from underrepresented racial or ethnic minority groups (e.g. Black or African American, Hispanic or Latino, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native).
 - II. Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersexual, Asexual or Two-Spirited (LGBTQIA2S+) individuals or gender non-conforming individuals.
 - III. Individuals living with disabilities.

- Applicants who identify with multiple underrepresented or marginalized identities (e.g., intersectionality of race, gender, or disability) are especially encouraged to apply. Your unique perspectives are essential in driving inclusive excellence in transplant pharmacy.

Financial consideration

We are committed to supporting applicants from diverse financial backgrounds. Preference will be given to those who have demonstrated financial need within their application. This ensures equitable access to opportunities, especially for those whose circumstances might otherwise limit their participation in AST activities.

New practitioner requirements

New practitioners are required to submit an abstract or topic for presentation at the World Transplant Conference 2025, in addition to their application. Selection for new practitioners is contingent upon acceptance of the abstract or presentation at WTC.

Commitment to DEIB

Applicants are expected to have demonstrated or have a strong desire to advancing DEIB initiatives within the field of transplant pharmacy. This commitment can be shown through various forms, including but not limited to:

- Involvement in DEIB-related clinical work, research or committee service.
- Community service that promotes equity and inclusion in healthcare.
- Personal or professional advocacy for underrepresented or marginalized groups.

Upon participation in WTC, recipients of the scholarship are required to complete an online survey. This survey should include a brief description of their future plans to pursue transplant pharmacy and/or how they intend to continue promoting DEIB initiatives within the field.

- 4. Letter of recommendation (1):**

One letter of recommendation from a solid organ transplant pharmacist OR from a pharmacist who has been involved in DEIB activities.
- 5. New Practitioners Only:**

A copy of the abstract or topic submitted for presentation at the AST meeting. If your abstract or topic has not yet been accepted, note that awards will be contingent on its acceptance.
